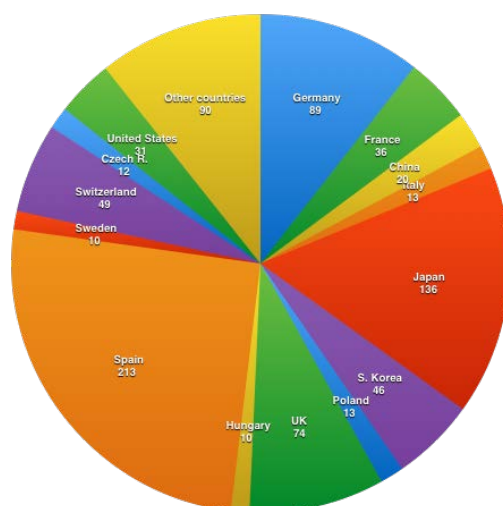




OMCOS was organized for the first time in Spain, in Sitges, a small touristic town south of Barcelona, in Catalonia. The occasion again was marked by great talks by preeminent scientists from around the world, with strong participation from industry and academia, graduate students, postdoctoral fellows and faculty.



Over 840 attendees gathered in Sitges from June 28 until July 2, 2015. They arrived representing more than 40 countries. More than 500 were young participants (graduate students and postdoctoral fellows). They gathered to attend presentations from 9 Plenary Lecturers and a further 14 Invited Lecturers. In addition, 12 Short Talks were selected from the presented posters. The symposium was dedicated to Prof. José Barluenga as the OMCOS 18 Guest of Honor.

The conference enjoyed important support from various groups. Industrial support was received from BASF, Lilly, Thieme, the Royal Chemical Society, the American Chemical Society, Advanced Synthesis & Catalysis, Springer, Strem, Sigma Aldrich, Thieme, and Asahi Spectra. The Royal Spanish Chemical Society (RSEQ) (Organic and Organometallic divisions, and the Catalan section of RSEQ) was a main sponsor as was the ICIQ (Severo Ochoa program). The Yen Chuang Foundation also continued its long-standing support of OMCOS with its funding of the OMCOS Award.

The symposium started Sunday night with a lecture by Robert G. Bergman (the Lilly-OMCOS 18 plenary lecture), which was followed by a reception cocktail at the Terramar Gardens in Sitges enlivened by groups of *bastoners dancers*, *castellers* and *ball de diables* (devils dance), as examples of the very rich Catalan folklore.



The scientific program continued next Monday morning with the second Plenary Lecture delivered by Jieping Zhu. Further Plenary Lectures were presented over the course of the week including Helmut Schwarz, Kálmán J. Szabó, Todd Marder, Naoto Chatani, A. Stephen K. Hashmi, and Sukbok Chang. In addition, there were 14 Invited Lectures from Sarah E. Reisman, Vladimir Gevorgyan, Troels Skrydstrup, Naohiko Yoshikai, Marta Catellani, Pedro J. Pérez, Cathleen M. Crudden, Ning Jiao, Cristina Nevado, Nobuharu Iwasawa, Juan Carlos Carretero, Jonathan Medlock, Franziska Schoenebeck, and Olivier Baudoin.

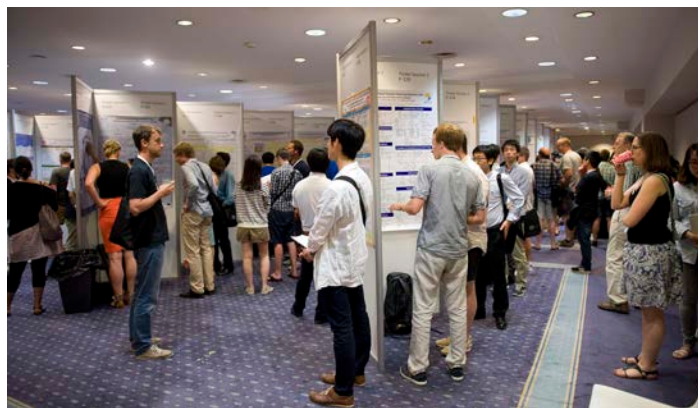

Two rich poster sessions on Monday and Wednesday totaling 620 contributions were also part of this meeting. Eight of these posters received awards during the closing ceremony. The organizing committee is grateful to Thieme and the RSC for supporting the prizes.



Tuesday afternoon was reserved for excursions to visit Barcelona, in particular, to get to see La Sagrada Familia Basilica by Antoni Gaudí. Other attendants decided to stay at the beach in Sitges enjoying an excellent sunny day.

A Speaker's Dinner sponsored by Thieme was held on Tuesday night at a local restaurant, while the traditional conference banquet was held on Wednesday night and drew a huge crowd. At the occasion, we thanked all the contributors to the event, from speakers to organizers to administrative assistance and to the students that help keep the event on track and on schedule.
